The 1997 cohort includes all full-time, degree seeking undergraduate students who enrolled for the first time at Northwestern College in the Fall Term of 1997 and who have not previously enrolled at any other postsecondary institution. Athletic participants include those who received athletically related financial aid in their first semester of attendance. In accordance with federal regulations, the BA graduation rate includes includes all those who graduated from Northwestern College within six years of matriculation, or 150 percent of the normal time for degree completion (AA graduation rate - three years). Students in the cohort who transferred to other institutions, were dismissed, or dropped out of school are counted as non-graduates.
