The 1999 cohort includes all full-time, degree seeking undergraduate students who enrolled for the first time at Northw estern College in the Fall Term of 1999 and who have not previously enrolled at any other postsecondary institution. Athletic participants include those who received athletically related financial aid in their first semester of attendance. In accordance with federal regulations, the BA graduation rate includes

all those w ho graduated from Northw estern College w ithin six years of matriculation, or 150 percent of the normal time for degree completion (AA grdaution rate - three years). Students in the cohort w ho transferred to other institutions, w ere dismissed, or dropped out of school are counted as non-graduates.
